GREAT AND HOLY PASCHA

Our Lord was crucified, died, and was buried on Friday, before the setting of the sun, which was the first of His "three days" in the grave; observing the mystical Sabbath, that "seventh day" in which it is said that the Lord "rested from all His works" (Gen. 2:2-3), He passed all of Saturday in the grave; and He arose "while it was yet dark, very early in the morning" on Sunday, the third day, which, according to the Hebrew reckoning, began after sunset on Saturday. As we celebrate today this joyous Resurrection, we greet and embrace one another in Christ, thereby demonstrating our Saviour's victory over death and corruption, and the destruction of our ancient enmity with God, and His reconciliation toward us, and our inheritance of life everlasting.

Greetings,

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pascha is our faith's most sacred and joyful celebration—the Feast of Feasts! In a few short weeks, we will come together to proclaim Christos Anesti!—Christ is Risen! His resurrection is the victory of life over death, fulfilling God's promise to us. Through the journey of Great Lent and Holy Week, we prepare our hearts, and we will then rejoice in the light of His triumph. Pascha is more than a celebration; it is the foundation of our faith, filling us with hope, love, and renewal. Let us carry this joy into our lives, sharing the light of Christ with all.

With the above in mind, we now move on to the administrative aspects of the parish. Firstly, please purchase your Taste of the Mediterranean tickets and/or sponsorships as soon as possible to avoid missing the event. Tickets are pre-sale only, and the committee has worked hard to ensure that the requested changes were made and that a great event takes place.

The parish council meeting occurred on March 16th and, as always, covered several topics: the church bookkeeper, the choir scholarship fund, a sign on Old Canton Road, pressure washing the parking lot, the Pantokrator project, and icons on the walls. We have hired a bookkeeper, Kim Humphreys, to help with the financials. This will help decompress the load and provide a resource capable of handling our accounting needs. We are looking forward to working with her.

Unfortunately, the sign on Old Canton was blown down in a storm a few weeks ago. It was noticed before blowing into the road and placed in the back of the church. Rainbow Signs is sending renderings and quotes for new signage on Old Canton and new panels for the Pear Orchard sign. This project has been on the list for a while, but there is now a sense of urgency with the existing sign being removed.

The rest of the parking lot was recently pressure-washed, and all the concrete was sealed to delay further maintenance. Its clean appearance now matches the tidiness of the painted church and a more well-groomed landscape. There are still some landscaping needs that will be sorted out soon.

Sanctuary-wise, we have received one of the icons ordered for the walls and hope to have the other nine soon. The iconography will be a great addition to the sanctuary and fill empty space as we work on a new project: a pantokrator. The depiction of Christ on the ceiling is breathtaking in parishes blessed to have one, and we hope that it will be the last step towards the consecration of our church. We have spoken with iconographers and the needed contractors and hope to have this information ready for approval at the spring general assembly. More to come soon!

The choir scholarship discussed in the prior newsletter has been approved. The

The choir scholarship discussed in the prior newsletter has been approved. The application and a flyer have been sent to Belhaven and Mississippi College, and both responded that they would send it out to students and faculty and promote it in their music departments. Millsaps has been contacted, and we hope to hear back soon. This scholarship will help a student interested in orthodoxy through tuition assistance

and help grow and revitalize an essential ministry in the church.

Lastly, please be on the lookout for an improved bookstore as inventory is ordered and

the space is refurbished to meet our parish's needs. A functional bookstore is a blessing to all parishes, and we are excited to soon have the improved resource.

The St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival is a nationwide ministry of the Department of Religious Education (DRE) of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. The Oratorical Festival provides a platform and experience where Greek Orthodox youth from grades 7-12 present speeches discussing the Faith and the Church. Participants can explore



and deepen their faith while honing their speech writing and public speaking skills.

This year, we will be hosting the district level competition for the Western Conference, which includes (in addition to our own parish) the churches of Baton Rouge, Biloxi, Ft. Walton Beach, Gulf Shores, Jackson, Mobile, Monroe, New Orleans, Panama City, and Pensacola.

The parish level festival will be held on April 12th, (Lazarus Saturday) after the pancake breakfast. The district level festival will be held two weeks later, on April the 26th.



Pantokrator

This rendering gives an idea of what the Pantokrator project would look like. The decorative beam in the center of that section would be removed and the steep angle of the sheetrock would be rounded out into a gradual curve. Christ and the Evangelists would have gold backgrounds matching the Panagia, and some up lighting would be installed to illuminate the icons. Please note that this rendering is not exact; final decisions regarding color and placement would be made in cooperation with the iconographer and the Metropolis, but this gives a broad conceptual idea of what is being considered.
