Background Checks and Youth Safety

As many of you have heard, the Greek Orthodox
Archdiocese of America has put in place a
requirement for all parishes to turn in a Youth Safety
report along with our election results in order to get
the results ratified. What this means is that parish
council candidates must pass a background check
(which was already in effect) and everyone who
works with children must pass a background check
and complete the Youth Safety modules. This includes
adult altar servers, Sunday School teachers, and
Greek School teachers.

While this can be seen as inconvenient, we should try to remember that this demonstrates that the Church takes the safety of children seriously and is making every effort to prevent any unfortunate event.

If you are one of the people involved in these ministries and have not already done so, please take a moment to complete these steps at your earliest convenience. Everyone involved should have already received instructions, but please do not hesitate to reach out to Fr. Mike if you encounter any difficulty and need help to finish the process. We appreciate everyone's time and effort as we strive to reach full compliance with the Youth Safety program.

We encourage all of our members in good standing to come vote for the candidates in person, or to submit an absentee ballot, which was sent out in the mail.
