#### **NATIVITY OF CHRIST**

John the Forerunner received a command from God and came into the parts of the Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance unto the remission of sins. Then our Saviour also came from Galilee to the Jordan, and sought and received baptism though The Heavens were opened, the Spirit descended in the form of a dove upon Him that was being baptized and the voice was heard from the Heavens hearing witness that this was the beloved Son of God, now baptized as a man. From these events the Divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ were demonstrated. It is also from this that the present feast is called "Theophany," that is, the divine manifestation, God's appearance among men.



### **Men and Women's Bible Study**


Our Men and Women's Bible Studies will be starting up again for the new year as of January 7th. They will again alternate Tuesdays, with the
