4TH ECUMENICAL COUNCIL

On the Sunday that falls from the 13th to the 19th of the present month, we chant the Service to the 630 Holy and God-bearing Fathers who came together for the 4th Ecumenical Council who assembled in Chalcedon in 451, to condemn Eutyches, who taught that there was only one nature, the divine, in Christ after the Incarnation, and Dioscorus, Patriarch of Alexandria, who illegally received Eutyches back into communion and deposed Saint Flavian, Patriarch of Constantinople, who had excommunicated Eutyches.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let us first highlight that July honors multiple important Saints in our church. Mary Magdalene is honored as the "Equal to the Apostles" for her role in proclaiming Christ's Resurrection to the disciples. She is remembered as a devoted follower of Jesus who stood by the Cross and was the first to witness the empty tomb. Saint Anna, the mother of the Theotokos, is venerated for her faith and for being the grandmother of Jesus Christ. Her feast day of her Dormition on July 25 celebrates her role in God's plan of salvation and her example of piety and perseverance in prayer.

The gyro drive-through held in June was a good one netting ~\$2,500. Thank you to everyone who was able to help in any capacity. The short events are great for food and fellowship and go a long way in meeting the many needs of the community. In addition, the spring general assembly was held on May 18th and a Taste of the Mediterranean townhall was held on June 1st. Projects and initiatives important to our parish were discussed at length and we appreciate everyone taking the time to stick around after liturgy and participate in the discussion. At the general assembly, we approved both the Old Canton sign and pantokrator project. We expect the sign to be in the ground by the end of the month with a final cost of \$9,726.30. Regarding the pantokrator, the iconographers are onboard with the "new" rendering presented at the general assembly that depicts Christ in the center, as is tradition, with a two-foot gold ring and angels circling. Fortunately, the price remained the same and we expect the entire project to be completed for ~\$35k. As seen, the location on the ceiling has been demoed, curved, and smoothed in preparation for the pantokrator. The entire ceiling should be finished being painted by mid-July with the icon to be put up in, as of now, August. This is an exciting project, and the finished product will be beautiful and bring us closer to our Lord and Savior.

Lastly, the townhall was productive with helpful thoughts and ideas flowing. Some major changes to be implemented include moving the event to February and having a new name as "Taste of Greece". The new name more accurately reflects the event while also helping with continuity moving forward. Smaller changes will be items such as offering a "student ticket" option and extending the wine tasting to 90 minutes. The new sponsorship packet and save the date will be sent to the parish early this month to provide ample time for sponsorships, especially with the event moving up. These are merely a few, with others certainly to be made as well.
