ELEVATION OF THE CROSS

Saint Helen, the mother of Saint Constantine the Great, undertook a journey to Jerusalem in search of the cross, about the year 325. A temple to Aphrodite had been raised up by the Emperor Hadrian upon Golgotha. The venerable Helen had the statue of Aphrodite destroyed, and the earth removed, revealing the Tomb of our Lord, and three crosses. Of these, it was believed that one must be that of our Lord, the other two of the thieves crucified with Him. A lady of Jerusalem, who was already at the point of death from a certain disease, was brought to touch the crosses, and as soon as she came near to the Cross of our Lord, she was made perfectly whole.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The parish council meeting took place on August 10th. It was, again, relatively brief and rehashed topics such as a narthex, the pantocrator project, and Sunday school upgrades. Unfortunately, but not unexpectedly, the iconographer continues to push back the pantokrator installation date. The latest news we have is that he returns from his Greek vacation at the end of this month.

We continue to gather information on a narthex build within. We have received a quote for the construction of a wall that would include double doors down the center aisle, an additional door on each outward aisle, soundproof glass, a floating ceiling within the narthex, and more. This would decrease capacity, but still provide seating for at least 112 (8 per pew) within the sanctuary and an additional 16 (two pews against the back wall) in the narthex. We hope to have things finalized in time for the fall general assembly. This project is seen as one of the last two "big" ones with the bathrooms being the other. We continue to gather information on how to improve the bathrooms both functionally and aesthetically in a cost effective manner. Prior quotes were unreasonable and we continue to work through options.

Lastly, Sunday School changes continue to take place. As previously mentioned, we thank Ellen Hontzas for her years of service as Sunday School Director and welcome her new role of teaching the children the hymns of the church. We also thank Heather Hontzas for stepping up and taking on the Director role and the other Sunday school teachers for their tireless work in this important ministry. There is now a new curriculum, some room swapping, and room improvements. The children's sermon has been a welcome addition and we certainly thank Fr. Mike for helping make the children a focus of our community.
